How Do I Become A Volunteer Firefighter?

A successful candidate must:

 Be at least 18 years of age, have a valid drivers license, good driving record, and proof of vehicle insurance.

 Live within the fire district boundaries or close proximity.

- Respond to a minimum of 25% of all calls.
- Attend 75% of all training and maintenance meetings.
- Pass a Live Scan, Provide DMV printout of driving record, health physical and drug screen.
- Possess High School Diploma or GED

Being a volunteer firefighter is a way to give back to your community and to become a leader within it. Becoming a firefighter is one of the noblest ways to serve and protect your community. You would be playing a key role in keeping the community and all of its citizens safe.
